SMALL ART EXHIBITIONS IN MEETING ROOM

8 October – 12 November an Art Exhibition by Anna Dmochowski

12 November – 21 January 2019 an Art Exhibition by Derek Smart



Derek's introduction to the world or art was at the age of 8 years old, sitting in the school classroom applying watercolours to paper. At the age of 12 he was then introduced to technical drawing and his love of sketching grew, and he was often to be found with a notebook and pencil in his hand – but never a paintbrush.

At the age of 64, his wife, Linda, put a paint brush in his hand for the first time with the words "Trust" and "Believe" and presented him with a set of watercolour paints. A whole new world of colour opened before him and art became his passion. Drawn to nature and his love

of animals, but best of all his won imagination, brought about a desire to capture the essence of the living world. **Museum entry fees apply**

Proceeds from the sale of his work will be donated to The Children's Hospice South West.

1ST FLOOR EXHIBITION ROOM

16 – 20 October "A Book is a Dream you Hold in your Hand"

An exhibition by ABCD (handmade artists' books) and John Rowlands-Pritchard (painted inscriptions). ABCD is a group of book-artists who meet monthly at Dove Studios in Butleigh. The group includes creative writers and visual artists, and some who are both.

Their new work for this exhibition includes one-off books and small editions, and ranges from traditional forms of binding to inventive



and sculptural pieces that challenge preconceptions about what may be described as "a book". The content is just as important as the cover.

Individual members have work collections as diverse as The Library of Alexandria and The Queen's Collection. John Rowlands-Pritchard is well-known both as a singer and for his lettering on paper, canvas, glass and stone. **Free Entry to exhibition only**

MUSEUM EVENTS

Saturday 13 October 10am – 4pm - Wells Museum and Wells Art Contemporary



During the Wells Art Contemporary exhibition at the Bishop's Palace, (8-22 October), the museum is going to have an exciting and innovative display of contemporary art by the Somerset Guild of Craftsmen. The 10 pieces, known as "Interventions" will all be inspired by the museum's collection: with fabrics, glass, ceramic, mosaic and stone, the craftsmen and women are producing work that will help us look at everything with new eyes.

People are being invited to get involved in this creative process, and we will be holding a free workshop, open to both children and adults, which will also use the museum's exhibits as inspiration. Led by local artist Philippa Threlfall and local historian Clare Blackmore – both Trustees of the museum, there will be an opportunity to make original pieces in clay, paint, pen, pencil and collage.

There are lots of things in the museum to use as a basis for an original work of art: the original swan who was taught to ring the moat bell, the finds from Wookey Hole Caves, fossils, skeletons, glass and ceramics, embroidered samplers and of course items from the First World War display.

Working alongside Philippa and Clare, it is hoped that people will enjoy this free opportunity to be creative. There is also going to be an opportunity to help make a mosaic using antique shards from the museum's collection, which it is hoped will go on permanent display in the museum garden. **Free entry to workshop**

Saturday 27 October 10am – 4pm – "Portraits of the People of Wells"

Wells and Mendip museum is the custodian of the Philipps Portrait collection, which is an unique and fascinating archive of the faces of the ordinary Wells residents around the turn of the 19th & 20th centuries, and a selection of these stunning photographs will be on display in our Lecture Hall. Some of the sitters in the portraits have been researched and some fascinating stories are beginning to emerge about their lives – some happy, some sad and some tragic. It is hoped that by putting on this display, more stories will begin to unfold and the social history of Wells enriched by their telling.

Ismalia Kate went on to marry a slaughterman, Thomas Bennett and they had four children. Thomas died young, at 32, and he and Ismalia were buried in Easton Church. With the help of the church warden, Clare Blackmore, a museum Trustee and local historian, found a little stone cross under a tree in the churchyard overgrown and covered with ivy. The stone has now been uncovered, and flowers have been placed there, so she is once again remembered. Free entry to display

Archives Catalogue – The main focus of work continues to be the Archives Catalogue, which will be released online once it's complete. Only about half of the collection was catalogued when Julia (the Archivist) took over, so it's a mammoth piece of work!

The National Archives' Engagement Officer for the West visited the City Archives in August and was very encouraging about all that we're doing.

Heritage Open Day – On 8th September, the Town Hall opened its doors for Heritage Open Day. Julia had organized displays of local interest there, and collaborated with the **Wells Mills Interest Group** to produce the wonderful exhibition they had researched and written. It and the rest of the displays received an incredible 821 visitors in the space of six hours. If you missed the Mills exhibition, do not fear - you'll be able to see it at the Museum next February!
