"The most poetic of English Cathedrals", this deeply spiritual site is the earliest English Cathedral to be built in the Gothic style. Sir Simon Jenkins not only names Wells Cathedral as one of the great Cathedrals in England, but also as his favourite.


Built between the 12th and 15th centuries it boasts unique features, including the beautiful 'scissor arches' and the famous Wells clock. If you stay for Evensong you may be lucky enough to hear the exhilarating voices of the world-famous Wells Cathedral Choir.

THE BISHOP'S PALACE & GARDENS

Home to the Bishops of Bath and Wells for over 800 years, this stunning medieval palace, surrounded by a moat, is open for all to enjoy.

There are 14 acres of outstanding, RHS Partner gardens to explore, including the well pools from which the city takes its name and a play area hidden in the Arboretum.

WELLS & MENDIP MUSEUM

Wells & Mendip Museum was founded in 1893 by Herbert E. Balch, a renowned amateur archaeologist, naturalist and caver. The museum was originally intended to showcase his extensive collections of historical artefacts and natural specimens.

Learn how the rich mineral wealth of the Mendip Hills has impacted the area and its inhabitants, discover the amazing history of cave exploration in the Mendip Hills and meet the real witch of Wookey Hole from the prehistoric past.
